The Burial Register for St Alphege Canterbury records that Jeffery Smyth als Rayman was buried on 6 December 1571 – that is just 2 days after making his will./ see also inventory of Jeffrye Smythe/

In the name of god amen memoranda that the/ iiiith day of december Anno d[omi]ni 1571 and in the xiiiith/ yeare of the Reigne of o[ur] sovereigne Lady Elizabeth Quene/ of England Fraunce and Ireland defendo[r] of the faithe &/ That I Jeffery Smythe al[ia]s Rayman of the parishe of/ St Alphege in the City of Caunterbury mercer, being sicke/ of body but whole of mynde and of good and perfecte/

Remembraunce thanks be unto god doe make my laste wyll and/

Testament in manner and fourme following that is to saye, Firste/ I bequethe betake and com[m]end my soule into the handes of almightye/

God o[ur] heavenly father and unto o[ur] Redemer Lorde and Savio[ur] Jesus/

Christe and the holye Ghoste the Comforter of all his afflycted/ membres, and to all the blessed company of heaven beseching hym/

that I maye throughe his grace willinglye prepare myselfe/

Redye w[i]th a constant faithe patiently to abyde such correctyon,/ plague or afflict[i]on as it shall please his godly will to try me/ w[i]thall, whether it be for the punishement of my sinnefull lyfe/

or to call me unto his mercy. Secondly, I bequethe my bodye/

to the grounde from whence it came forsaking the worlde w[i]thall/ his pompe pryde and vanitye, forgeving all that hathe at any/ tyme offended me as freely as I Beseche god to forgive me, and my/

sayde body to be buryed in the church yarde of the sayde parishe/ of St Alphege. Item I geve and Bequethe unto thirtye poore/ folkes thirty groates to be distributed after my deathe. Item I geve/

and bequethe unto Robert Robyns upon considerat[i]on of his paynes/

taken for me at diverse tymes thirty shillinges. Item I geve/

and bequethe to the personne of the sayde parishe of St Alphege/ for his paines tenne Shillynges. Item I geve and bequeth to Richard/

Wilmote being one of the Overseers to se my goodes in savegarde/

to the use of William my Sonne twenty shillings. The Reste of/ my goodes not here bequethed after my debtes and Legacyes be payde/

I geve and bequethe to the sayde my sonne whome I make ordeine/

and constitute my full and sole Executo[r]. Item I make & ordeine/

the sayde Mr Atkyns person of St Alphege and Richarde/ Wilmote my Overseers. Witnesses to this Mathew Biglande/ Robart Clarke, Richarde Wylmote, and John Atkyns/ person of the sayde parishe of Saynt Alphege with diverse/ other &r/

[The probate clause which is in Latin states that the will was proved on 2 January 1571 English style (Julian calendar) by the oaths of Richard Atkins and Richard Wilmotel/
